

W. Arthur Mehrhoff, Ph.D. (Emeritus) has an extensive background in community design. He holds an M.A. in Urban Affairs from Washington University in Saint Louis and a Ph.D. in American Studies (emphasis on material culture) from Saint Louis University. He worked for over a decade in Main Street and downtown planning/revitalization in his hometown of St. Louis, MO., then for fifteen years in Minnesota where he earned a Presidential Citation from the Minnesota chapter of the American Institute of Architects for his community design work with the award-winning Minnesota Design Team. He has also worked extensively on community design with Missouri communities through the Governor's DREAM initiative (2007-2008), Missouri River Communities Network (2005-2010) and, more recently, the Missouri Humanities Council. He has also written three books including Community Design: A Team Approach to Dynamic Community Systems (1999) for Sage Publications. He retired this fall after a decade as the Academic Coordinator for the Museum of Art & Archaeology at the University of Missouri.
